My experience related to interdisciplinary matters of DLDD has started since beginning of my work way back in 1986 the day I joined in Social Work & Research Centre at Kashipur, Rayagada. It is the place of high degradation, vulnerable eco-system, devastated livelihood, ravaged resource base, deteriorated quality of life, malnourished environment, lack of confidence and capacity for entitlement and access to resource base has created immense imbalance and embarrassing caused impoverishment of vulnerable sections. Erratic rainfall, undulated terrain, fragmented ecology followed by frequency of droughts and disasters has severely affected the state of economic affairs in Odisha since last few decades. Ill-conceived policies, inadequate positive political will has fuelled to marginalisation manifold affected life and livelihood, distress migration, degradation and climate chaos, livelihoods issues where I started my work.

Am a Development Catalyst with 30 years of experience in managing human relationships, environmental and development initiatives especially on Community Resilience with reference to natural resource management, watershed stabilization, rejuvenation of Depleted Areas, Areas affected by Climate Change & Disaster Vulnerabilities.

During my involvement we have emphasized action, advocacy, reflection, research & action as a tool to development tool that has made very simple in our work process with measurable impact . We have implemented initiatives as per ground reality and giving more community wits & wisdom in blending with scientific advices as community is end user and participation is important.

Under my leadership at UDYAMA ,we have demonstrated onsite activities and its Responsiveness to Social, Ecological Development and Change Management towards mitigating drought, disaster and desertification, Green Energy, protecting environment and connecting livelihood development . The objective is to link to the broader view of poverty ,Highlight the crucial role of 'context' (especially vulnerability-context) – and how this influences the asset base, the selection of livelihood strategies, and the outcomes for households. Give space to local perspectives, Build on what exists - a multidimensional, integrated perspective that unites the concepts of economic development, reduced vulnerability, environmental sustainability. The "Community Based Risk Reduction and Livelihood Promotion" under micro- watershed perspective with an objective of backward and forward linkage is one of the successful activity that has linked to Farm & Non-farm based livelihood based on micro watershed perspective

Two decades together with community, UDYAMA has demonstrated few evidence based initiatives working directly and engaging partner NGOs in flood & drought prone areas and carved out good learning on Resilience & Adaptation process in India. Learning-Linking-Livelihoods is the core areas of UDYAMA that has scaled and replicated in urban, coastal, rural , tribal hinter lands. Founded in 1997, UDYAMA primarily aims towards strengthening and building capacities of local communities towards rejuvenating human, ecological, economical capital & well-being improvement with a view to enhancing adaptation to vulnerability and changing the culture of self-reliance in harnessing resource base, blending with time honored & improved technology transformation incorporating inclusion, innovations to address next development challenges

There are two major components that we emphasized: 1) Promotion of climate change impacts resilient



integrated ecosystem based livelihood models with Green Energy and, ii) setting up institutional processes for learning, management and sustainability of project interventions.

UDYAMA has started partnership with Green Energy & End Poverty on Solar home lights and has completed very successfully , CLEAN has partnered with UDYAMA to expand and explore in promoting green energy , TERRI has partnered and commissioned solar home lights and fuel efficient cooking stoves, TRIVE Solar has expanded solar home lights and Hot Point Cook stoves has already partnered with UDYAMA consortium and demonstrated fuel efficient stoves at community. UDYAMA partnered with CRUX power to implement Mini-grids, Integrated Solar projects in tribal villaged to promote green energy and reduce dependency on conventional energy,.

UDYAMA has inspired by actions, demonstrated evidence based initiatives with reality contact on sustainable livelihoods & environmental richness in working directly with community & engaging partner NGOs & carved out good learning on resilience process. Strengthening & building capacities of local communities with a view to enhancing adaptation to vulnerability and mitigating development gaps, changing the culture of self-reliance in harnessing resource base, blending with time honored improved technology transformation with well-articulated development communication towards development perspective is the essence of UDYAMA's work-culture.

There has great contrast that endowed with rich resources and minerals, Odisha is considered as one of the most backward states based on human development index. Fact that many pro-people programs are being implemented by state , central government and CSOs are not enough to address poverty, malnutrition deaths , migration persist that has highlighted in all dailies. Reflection from ground is that of three important issues: Ecological Poverty, Poverty on Water & Nutrition, Manifold Disasters, Climate Variability,

All these have pushed back the development process and raising the economic burden, bringing wider imbalances. Recurrent and frequency of disasters are of survival question. Climate induced threats are getting compounded along with drudgery, migration& social disruption is increasing. Loss of bio-diversity& rampant degradation in tribal hinterlands & coastal plains without giving thought to conservation so that the pressure on natural habitat has widened the vulnerabilities. The problems of poverty, deprivation in the tribal regions in rural hinter lands are complex, intense and need to fairly address.



To implement broad based livelihoods resilience, UDYAMA has brought out concerted action, undertaken broad based partnership, accelerated cultural biodiversity conservation, and institutionalized resilience and adaptation process with value added initiatives. The objective is to complement & supplement the initiatives of government/mainstream and facilitate to strengthen community institutions to carry forward human adaptation initiatives. Initiatives are very much innovations, knowledge transformation and shared responsibility in order to minimize the adverse impact of multi-disaster risks, distress migration, biodiversity degradation and climate chaos in order to rejuvenate the resource base, building capability of ultra poor communities to enhance their bargaining ability, skill up gradation in order to access, avail entitlements, empowerment with regard to:

- **provisioning inputs & knowledge base,**
- **protecting resource base from degradation**
- **promoting skills, entrepreneurship, technology & risk transfer**

To Empower community leaders, youths, women, farming communities towards self resilient process in gearing greening and adoption of cultural biodiversity promotion, promote Eco-preneurs for better income and self reliance & dignity. The benefit is maximum in order to protect land mass degradation & water, forest from deterioration, utilizing ecologically sensitive indigenous and alternative methods for maximum utilization, rejuvenation, rehabilitation, better harvest followed by adoption low emission development initiatives with added skill that has helped to achieve important prerequisites for resilient development, environmental sustainability & livelihoods empowerment on enterprising mode.

Networking and alliance building efforts: UDYAMA's main strength lies in alliance building and facilitating collective actions. Collective efforts emerge as an important prerequisite to address the complex web of poverty, livelihoods and migration & skill building.

UDYAMA has actively responded to this situation and emphasized wider partnership and participation for greater impacts particularly in Inland, Central, Western and Southern Odisha and neighboring states of India. An outcome of this can be visualized in form of generation of considerable synergy among the local NGOs and CBOs due to collective endeavors. One of the key focuses of networking has been established to undertake challenges of reducing environmental risks through capacity building of local communities and sustainable management of natural resources and rehabilitation of local livelihoods. UDYAMA has actively contributed to the process of facilitation of networks at different levels (nationally & regionally) to address the larger livelihood options. UDYAMA has played the role of a direct facilitating agency and in others it has actively supported the ongoing process mobilization working with networks and various stakeholders. Since there has good synergy to begin with we have worked together with more than 45 Partner NGOs for end water poverty, skill building

On environment:

Since its inception Udyama is involved in facilitating the process of strengthening of community forestry institutions. This is the prime activity under taken that has been accelerating with and without fund. The crux is more than 60 CBOs and few NGOs involvement in forest protection and conservation in Nayagarda, undivided Phulbani and undivided Bolangir and western odisha. Focus is for protection of forest rather than plantation regionally as this is a multi utility action to save daily livelihoods for large vulnerable sections and benefiting for rich even and conservation micro-flora and fauna, biodiversity without any investment. Strengthening Community Forest Management efforts is the highlights

Overwhelming Response: things are wide spreading and expanding. For this purpose local and regional forest protection committees have formed and annual meeting are being organizing, a regulated body is there to provide support to individual and common need even rituals. In few cases community watchman's are safe guarding to protect forest (Sakeri, Rabigadia, Korapitha, Baunshagadia, Magarabandh, Malisara, Mukatapur, Nabaghanpur, Machhipada, of Nayagada and in many places in budh, sonapur, Redhakhole-Sambalpur, keonjhar, Anugul and Dhenkanal Districts) instead of government forest guard, also community members are taking initiative holding meeting in rotation for scaling up area and villages.

Benefit without investment : Good amount of silt and large amount of humus is gathering during heavy rain and adding productivity and production sustaining fertility for longer period, that helps to curtailing expenses on fertilizer and land reclamation due to flash flood sand deposition.



Important thing is that flow water available in the rivulets up to beginning of April and double crops also are being cropped due to residual moisture and recharge.

Activities and Initiatives: Development communication is our greatest tool to pass the messages for generating ownership and entitlements over resources. . These are being used in training and meeting purposes and exposed to cross cutting dialogue debate and deliberations at various fora.

Nursery raising, distribution of fruit bearing tress, multipurpose tree species is also regular activity. Farm land development and back yard forestry, plantation of economic plant species on tank embankments with the BPL families aimed at income enhancement has been another linkage program. These activities covered more than 15 villages in Nayagarh and Bolangir District,

Organizing meeting, workshops interacting directly with groups is another advocacy and awareness program for intensification and expanding nature conservation, biodynamic agriculture. Cross sectoral interactions have been undertaken especially particularly in Bolangir, Titilagada, Ganjam, Nayagada, Anugul, Dhenkanal, Boudh, Sonepur and Sambalpur for PRIs, local representatives MLA, chairman, Local officials with focused groups to carry forward the messages on issues, challenges and initiatives undertaken in country sides on current program on environment, climate change, forest conservation, institution building for its efficacy and sustaining the process

Farmers exposure, to practicing organizations, farms and farmers fields , community interaction in practicing both on forest and farming has been to Ganjam, Nayagada , Farm forestry area , exposed to SRI (systematic rice intensification) organically grown and conservation initiatives with Udyama and Network,

Aids and IECs: Udyama has collected few success stories, CDs, Films, Audio visuals on various themes from locally, other organizations within Orissa and India. These are all largely on environments, Nature conservation, water sheds rehabilitation, pollution, resource managements, eco-system managements, water regulation, agro forestry, farm forestry, micro- structures, sustainable agricultures, waste land development, coastal resource management, institution building, Self help and entrepreneurship development, climate change, Drought , flood managements, drinking water and Rural sanitation and RTI and disasters and livelihoods restoration in drought, and flood areas..

Besides, good numbers of flexes (around 100) have been developed in multi-color on various themes, are good to look-learn-link-livelihoods and gearing greening.. Local dialects and colocal languages, folk lore's, songs and caption in English have been used either in a song or local dialogue with pictorial representation.

On Drought Proofing: This is very a micro-scale initiatives in (Nayagada 10 villages), Bolangir 20 villages, Gajapati (13 villages and few areas in Phulabani (9 villages) and in Nawarangpur (6villages). We are focusing village as a unit.

Three things have been envisaging under this program:

1-Protection of upper reach from erosion and further degradation, (with biological, technical and mechanical measures)

2- Insitu conservation of water thru creation micro-structures (water bodies, soil trap structures, gully control structures, embankment protection thru series of micro-netting)

3-Utilization of stored water at the command and down .Here is a farmer's participation is very much essential and larger contribution is catchments protection and after care what people have demonstrated. Since farmers are getting immediate benefit not only from water and double crop, but the large amount saving the land from sand casting from flash flood for which livelihood has become threatened for years together. For this purposes few model villages have been done and MLP has been completed and few micro-projects have done are without MLP due to better community participation. And in 20 villages Entry point works have been completed and looking for minimum support to complete the left out activity.

In western Orissa: the "Community Based Risk Reduction and Livelihood Promotion" under micro-watershed perspective with an objective of backward and forward linkage: Activities are under Farm based livelihood based on micro watershed perspective:
Diversification of agricultural and horticulture practices



Extension program - to revive and diversify the agricultural practices for protection of catchments and utilization of command area (up land, medium land and homestead area)

Promoting community based institutions / farmers' Groups - for self-employment and to generate own produce.

Agri-Horticulture /Silvi-culture as alternate food security and best resource utilization

Managing seed/grain Banks and Group Funds

Skills, Knowledge, Information through capacity building initiatives

Skill enhancement for value chain management

- 800 hectares of SRI & crop Diversification in Coastal districts , and adopted resilient farming practices
- 20 nos farming clubs and one FPO Promotion involved in Eco-Agriculture in four Blocks ,

- 100 hectares of green forest protected by Godipatana community and successfully-managed ,
