Background and purpose:

A growing number of migrants come from regions affected by drought and desertification. Cities are the main recipients of desertification-induced migrants. The financial and human cost to society of such massive displacements can be huge due to the social, political and economic tensions it causes. However, cities have the tools to assist in the search for an answer to these challenges.

For this reason the City of Rome, the CCD Secretariat and the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) are organizing a Forum of Mayors on Cities and Desertification. The assembled mayors and local authorities from all continents will seek to promote the sustainable development of cities and their hinterlands in the light of problems created by desertification. They will analyze the problem, discuss some case studies, and set the basis for future initiatives of "jumelage" and decentralized cooperation, in the framework of the CCD's "bottom-up" approach. The Mayor of Rome will be invited to report on the forum to the COP.

Background and purpose:

The NGO Forum will be one day of workshops and open dialogue emphasizing the following themes: women, local experiences, communication and partnerships (this theme will be taken up during the plenary session on Thursday 8 October). It aims at the following general objectives:

- To enhance the idea of partnership between representatives from civil society and government representatives.
- To provide information and the exchange of thoughts, perceptions and ideas between communities/NGOs, governments and intergovernmental agencies.
- To inform decision-makers about the needs of local people.
- To highlight the on-going participatory mechanisms conducive to the facilitation of the implementation of the Convention.
- To present successful pilot projects related to the implementation of the Convention and local communities.
- To promote the integration of local knowledge in the NAP framework and processes in a way that re-inforces community value systems.
- To show the perception of desertification at grass-root level, the reality on-the-ground problems.

Background and purpose:

This forum is organized by the CCD Secretariat and the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD). The first event is a morning workshop that will explore how to improve the way the international community communicates and publicizes the struggle against desertification, especially through the press. The workshop will include an examination of the outreach strategies used by successful campaigners on behalf of issues other than desertification. The second event is an afternoon press seminar featuring top international experts on the scientific and socio-economic aspects of desertification. This seminar will provide essential background on the issues underlying and shaping the political talks at the COP.
