Status report on the 2010–2011 reporting and review process as of 12 November 2010

Note by the secretariat

Summary

This document provides a status report on the 2010–2011 reporting and review process as of 12 November 2010, the formal deadline for submissions of inputs from reporting entities. Information contained in the reports provided by that deadline was included in the compilation and preliminary analysis prepared by the secretariat and the Global Mechanism as contained in documents ICCD/CRIC(9)/3 to 10.

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I. Introduction

1. By its decision 12/COP.9, the Conference of the Parties (COP) established the system for performance review and assessment of the implementation of the Convention and of the 10-year strategic plan and framework to enhance the implementation of the Convention (2008–2018) (The Strategy). By its decision 11/COP.9 (terms of reference of the Committee for the Review of the Implementation of the Convention (CRIC)), the COP defined the scope of the review process, by, inter alia, deciding that the CRIC will review the implementation of the Convention and The Strategy by the Parties by undertaking an assessment of implementation against performance indicators every two years. By its decision 13/COP.9, the COP provisionally adopted these indicators and related methodologies and procedures.

II. Status of the 2010–2011 reporting and review process as of 12 November 2010

2. Eighty-nine affected country Parties submitted their national reports before the deadline of 12 November 2010. Thirty reports were from Africa (7 from Central Africa, 4 from Eastern Africa, 3 from Northern Africa, 6 from Southern Africa and 10 from Western Africa). Twenty-eight reports were from Asia (5 from Central Asia, 3 from East Asia, 4 from the Pacific, 4 from South Asia, 5 from South East Asia and 8 from West Asia). Seventeen reports were submitted by Latin American and Caribbean affected country Parties (3 from the Andean subregion, 7 from the Caribbean, 3 from the South Cone and 4 from Mesoamerica). Five Northern Mediterranean and 9 Central and Eastern European affected country Parties also submitted reports.

3. Altogether, twelve developed country Parties submitted their reports. Two country Parties from the Northern Mediterranean submitted reports both as affected and developed country Parties.

4. The Global Environment Facility (GEF) also submitted its report, as did the Global Mechanism (GM). No other United Nations agency or intergovernmental organization submitted a report.

5. Eleven reports were uploaded on the PRAIS portal by accredited civil society organizations, containing submissions of best practices on sustainable land management technologies, including adaptation.

6. An overview of the status of the reporting process is given in table 1 below, which also contains information on the completeness of the reports uploaded on the PRAIS portal and the number of submissions of best practices on sustainable land management technologies, including adaptation. Tables 2 to 7 contain more detailed information on the reporting process by reporting entity, as well as by region and subregion, where applicable.
