



TERMS OF REFERENCE

Senior Expert Forest Conservation and Restoration

Consultancy reference number: CCD/22/GI/C/35

Background

Desertification, along with climate change and the loss of biodiversity were identified as the greatest challenges to sustainable development during the 1992 Rio Earth Summit. Established in 1994, the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD) is the sole legally binding international agreement linking environment and development to sustainable land management. The Convention seeks to support countries to address Desertification, Land Degradation, and Drought (DLDD). (www.unccd.int)

The G20 (or Group of Twenty) is the annual international forum for the governments of 19 industrialized countries and the European Union (EU). The G20 Leaders' Declaration, issued on Sunday, 22 November 2020, launched a "Global Initiative on Reducing Land Degradation and Enhancing Conservation of Terrestrial Habitats". Building on existing initiatives and on a voluntary basis, the G20 countries share the ambition to achieve a 50 percent reduction in the amount of degraded land by 2040. The Global Initiative (GI) with oversight from UNCCD, will focus on capacity building, engaging the private sector and civil society and showcasing success. The Director, under the oversight of the Executive Secretary of the UNCCD, manages the Initiative Coordination Office (ICO).

Forests are an important terrestrial ecosystem that is important to be studied for developing restoration and conservation opportunities and options. The Initiative coordination office is looking for a senior expert on Forests Management to support the initiative.

Objective of consultancy

Conservation and Restoration of Forests are fully integrated into the G20 planning.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Under the direct supervision of the Director Global Initiative the incumbent will undertake the following tasks:

- Prepare a review paper on the "State of the Restoration and Conservation Practices of Forests Ecosystems".
- To organize an international expert group meeting on Restoration and Conservation of Forest Ecosystems, working with the partners.
- To support the production of knowledge and communication products on Forests Conservation and Restoration.
- To conduct webinars and training sessions on Forest Conservation and Restoration.
- To identify important institutions (up to 20) around the world who has been active in the field of peatland restoration and conservation.
- To identify key experts (up to 100) around the world who have been active in the field of peatland restoration and conservation.
- To prepare a listing of major restoration projects ongoing in the field of Forests and the lessons learned from those efforts.
- To represent the G20 Initiative in international fora upon request from the Director of the Global Initiative.
- To be the domain lead in the G20 Land Initiative Community of Practice on Forest Ecosystems; Conservation and Restoration.



Deliverables

Key deliverables are:

- ✓ A review paper on State of the Restoration and Conservation Practices of Forest Ecosystems
- ✓ List of key institutions and individuals involved in the field of Forest ecosystems
- ✓ Events organized and represented
- ✓ Final report

Contractual terms

The services of the selected individual contractors will be required for 50 days during the period from 1st September 2022 to 31st August 2023, home based. All products resulting from this contractual arrangement are the exclusive property of the Global Initiative/UNCCD.

Requirements

- A PhD in Science, Engineering or Management, with publication record on Forest Conservation and Restoration is required.
- At least 20 years of international experience in Peatland Conservation and Restoration is required.
- Excellent writing, editing and oral communication skills in English is required.

Special notice

Only individuals who can act as independent, individual economical operators are qualified to apply. Individuals who can provide their services only on account of an institution or enterprise not in their individual capacity are not eligible under this procedure.

Individuals engaged under a consultancy or individual contract will not be considered “staff members” under the Staff Regulations and Rules of the United Nations Secretariat and will not be entitled to benefits provided therein (such as leave entitlements and medical insurance coverage). Their conditions of service will be governed by their contract and the General Conditions of Contracts for the Services of Consultants and Individual Contractors. Consultant and individual contractor is responsible for determining tax liabilities and for the payment of any taxes and/or duties, in accordance with local or other applicable laws.
